- 3.) The staff will schedule your trip.

Advance Reservations

Twenty-four-hour reservations are suggested, especially for rural areas where services are less frequent. A minimum of (1) one hour before scheduled departure from the JCMTD office for all services. Service is on a space-available basis. If a human service agency sponsors your trip, their prior approval and reservation requirements will apply. Service animals may accompany a person with disabilities passengers onboard.

JCMTD Title VI Protection Notice to the Public

Seat Belt Usage
